The Hostage Deal: A Complete Defeat or a True Victory?	
<p>A Complete Defeat</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Postponement of the hostage deal - Entry into Rafah, more soldiers and hostages killed - Harm to relations with Egypt, Jordan, the USA, and Europe - Escalating international actions against Israel - The northern and southern borders remain under fire, prolonging the displacement of their residents - The Saudi-American deal proceeds without Israel - Accelerated international recognition of a Palestinian State without Israeli influence on the terms - Israeli responsibility for control and rehabilitation of the Gaza Strip at a significant human and economic cost - Hamas persists in its aggression against Israel, positioning itself as the true defender of Palestinians - The Jihadist axis in the Middle East strengthens while Israel becomes isolated 	<p>A True Victory</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Release of the hostages - Beginning the transfer the civil control and rehabilitation of the Gaza Strip to Arab and Western nations - Reaching a political solution in Lebanon - Over 100,000 displaced Israeli civilians begin to return to their homes in the northern and southern borders - The American Congress approves the mega-deal between the USA, Saudi Arabia, and Israel - The demise of the fantasy about the annihilation of the State of Israel - Integrating the Palestinians into the moderate axis (de-radicalization, de-militarization, political horizon) - Strengthening and stabilizing the Middle East's moderate axis, including Israel and the Palestinians, against the Iranian-Jihadist axis - Curbing the antisemitic and anti-Zionist sentiment globally
The Draft Law Crisis: Continuing the Judicial Overhaul or Forging a New Social Contract?	
<p>Continuing the judicial overhaul</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The government violates the law mandating the draft of yeshiva students (Defense Service Law, 1986) - The government breaches the Supreme Court's ban on funding yeshiva students - The government disregards the Attorney General's stance on the legality of government actions - The Knesset undermines Israel's democratic values, pushing a full-scale judicial overhaul 	<p>Forging a new social contract</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The government enforces the Defense Service Law, starting the enlistment of yeshiva students - Budgets are withheld from yeshiva students who haven't enlisted - Funds are reallocated to rehabilitate the Negev and Northern border areas, with coordinated efforts involving local residents - The Knesset sets a date for elections before October 7, 2024
National Remembrance Days: Disgraced Extremism or National Unity	
<p>Disgraced Extremism</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Cemetery riots during national remembrance events triggered by speeches from ministers who didn't serve in the IDF - The extreme right marches to Gaza, proclaiming "The People of Israel Resettle Gaza" 	<p>National Unity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - National reflection and solidarity with the hundreds of thousands affected on and since October 7th - Reaffirming the Declaration of Independence as the foundation of Israeli identity - Embarking on a path of healing and resurgence
